

## H.B. 13 Proponent Testimony Senate Energy & Public Utilities Committee November 17, 2020 Stephanie Keinath, Vice President Dayton Area Chamber of Commerce

Chairman Wilson and members of the Ohio Senate Energy & Public Utilities Committee, my name is Stephanie Keinath and I'm the Vice President of the Dayton Area Chamber of Commerce. I appreciate the opportunity to provide testimony in support of H.B. 13 today. As the leading voice of business in the Dayton region, the Dayton Area Chamber of Commerce represents over 2200 members across nine counties in southwest Ohio. For our members, and the business community as a whole, broadband access is a critical workforce issue.

The COVID-19 pandemic has forced all of us to re-examine how, and where, we work. For many businesses, this has meant expanding virtual meeting capabilities, shifting to remote or athorne work, and enhancing customer communication tools. The common thread these shifts is the critical need for broadband access.

House Bill 13 is one important component of the State of Ohio's broadband strategy. We applaud the work of Governor DeWine and Lt. Governor Jon Husted to prioritize digital infrastructure and broadband connectivity as central to our state's economic development. What was urgent pre-Covid, has now become acute, as businesses rely on broadband to connect their workforce and conduct their daily operations in ways we couldn't even envision ten months ago.

By establishing the state's first residential broadband expansion program, H.B. 13 will help Ohio's employers to connect and retain their workforce during these changing times. In particular, HB 13 will impact some of the rural areas of our state that have lacked access to adequate infrastructure. This grant program will make it easier to reach across long distances, connect isolated locations and keep Ohio competitive with other states when it comes to attracting and retaining new talent and business opportunities.
