MBP 20/40 SUPPLIER DIVERSITY INITIATIVE

The *Minority Business Partnership (MBP)* is an economic development initiative which helps grow our economy and strengthen area businesses by leveraging the Dayton region's minority assets. MBP creates supply chain opportunities for local businesses by pairing diverse businesses with large buying organizations within the region. MBP strategically focuses on two specific areas for building inclusion: capacity and creating connections in our region. In order to make those connections, MBP strives to identify our community's largest buying organizations and its sizable minority suppliers. This model engages the firms most ready to do business together.

The Minority Business Assistance Center (MBAC) identifies



and supports emerging diverse-owned businesses to cultivate their growth and sustainability. Supporting these

businesses means providing them with resources that include technical & professional assistance, access to capital, surety bonding, and connection to business opportunities through the assistance of the MBAC.

ESP is a program dedicated to advancing technology and

Provider Program (ESP), is led by the Entrepreneurs' Center in partnership with the State of Ohio and the Ohio Third Frontier Commission. MBP recruits and advocates for minority, women, rural, and veteran businesses in the Greater Dayton region.
