

The Department of Labor and the Federal Trade Commission recently issued rule changes that will affect employers nationwide. The Dayton Area Chamber of Commerce provides resources to help our members navigate these changes. Below are some FAQs and things to consider.

When does the overtime rule change?

The new rule begins to go into effect July 1st, 2024 to a threshold of \$844 per week (equivalent to \$43,888 per year). Then to \$1,128 per week (equivalent to \$58,656 per year) on January 1st, 2025. Salaried employees earning less than these amounts within the time frames will be overtime elidgeable.

When does the non-compete rule change?

The new rule goes into effect September 4th, 2024. As of this date most non-competes will be void and unenforceable with the exception of those currently in place for senior executives. After September 4th no new agreements may be entered into including senior executives.
